Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "Ok this is Sergeant Kenneth Findlay with the Internal Affairs Investigative Unit today is December 26, 2017, the time is now 9:48 am this is a recorded interview with Sergeant Gregory Martin who is a witness to investigation 2017-0636 and Greg before we went on record I gave you a chance to look at all the attachments here correct."

Sergeant Gregory Martin: "That's correct."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "In particular attachments C and Q were the ones that we were looking at which had to do with the FleetLE report correct?"

Sergeant Gregory Martin: "Yes."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "Ok if you could sir state your name unit number and date of hire."

Sergeant Gregory Martin: "Sergeant Gregory S. Martin the date of hire was February of 1999."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "Ok and you're your permanent assignment is Hammond right?"

Sergeant Gregory Martin: "Permanent is Hammond correct."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "Ok and how long have you acted in that capacity?"

Sergeant Gregory Martin: "I I've been a sergeant at Hammond since 2013 I believe."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "Ok at some point in looking at these in looking at these attachments here in particular looking at the FleetLE report attachment C and this is

Secretary Loisel her spreadsheet that she had said where she came up to do um to keep track of the vehicle I guess my question for you is this past summer June July August did you tell Emma to quit updating the FleetLE report?"

Sergeant Gregory Martin: "I don't recall ever telling her that and the reason I don't recall that is because it's not my I'm not in charge of the FleetLE report and I haven't been since uh I first came to Hammond, so I don't ever recall ever having that conversation with her."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "Ok um attachment Q."

Sergeant Gregory Martin: "Yes."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "Have you seen this attachment or anything like it before?"

Sergeant Gregory Martin: "It seems familiar to me because she has her own system of, of keeping track of things and I think Q is her system I don't think it's I don't think it's a post system that I recall seeing."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "Ok."

Sergeant Gregory Martin: "I mean I've seen the FleetLE reports before but mainly I had FleetLE reports back then but I, I to my knowledge I think this is her way of keeping track of what's paid and what's not paid."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "Ok alright so is this Q this attachment is this something you told her to develop?"

Sergeant Gregory Martin: "I'm pretty sure she came up with this on her own. I don't ever I never had FleetLE reports in my career until I came to Hammond and my concern with FleetLE report is, is to make sure when I had it because I was making sure our cars were serviced in a timely fashion and at that point they always were and then we had a post inspection that same year and there was no issues at all but this this is I, I don't ever recalling her not to do not to keep track of the FleetLE file or not to enter anything."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "Ok so you don't you don't remember just make sure I'm clear you don't ever remember telling her to quit updating the FleetLE?"

Sergeant Gregory Martin: "I, I do not recall ever telling her not to update the FleetLE report, it's not my duty I mean it's not."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "Now that was my next question."

Sergeant Gregory Martin: "Yeah."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "The reason why you don't is because it's not a function that you would have had."

Sergeant Gregory Martin: "That's correct. And, and I guess each, each supervisor that has and why I wouldn't and this is why I wouldn't recall telling her that is because each sergeant while we have to make sure things are done and done correctly you know some of us do things differently."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "Uh huh."

Sergeant Gregory Martin: "So, I'm not going to tell I'm not going to make a change on somebody's duty that they might not do it the same way I do it does that make sense?"

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "Yes."

Sergeant Gregory Martin: "Now in other words I'm not going to tell a sergeant how to do his duty just because I do it one way or I might do it different than them doesn't make it right or wrong but I'm not going to tell him to do it my way it's not how I operate."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "Ok."

Sergeant Gregory Martin: "So that's why I, I."

(Sergeant Kenneth Findlay coughing.)

Sergeant Gregory Martin: "I wouldn't make that I don't recall telling her that because that's not something I would routinely do is to make a decision on how to do something when it's not my duty."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "Ok alright is there anything you would like to add?"

Sergeant Gregory Martin: "I, I can't think of anything other than so I just kind of surprised to learn that I had allegedly told her not to complete the summary it's just something I don't recall ever telling her to or not to do."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "But I have one more question why would she why in her interview that's what she said why would she allege that?"

Sergeant Gregory Martin: "I have no idea."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "Ok."

Sergeant Gregory Martin: "I, I just don't recall ever telling her to do that, but."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "Ok so you don't remember and you said it would seem uncharacteristic for you to do it."

Sergeant Gregory Martin: "Yes correct."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "Because it's not your function."

Sergeant Gregory Martin: "Because it's not my duty right."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "Ok alright sir anything else?"

Sergeant Gregory Martin: "No."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "No is everything true and factual."

Sergeant Gregory Martin: "To the best of my knowledge."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "Ok at this time I issue the order Greg not to discuss this ai with anybody else, so we don't compromise its integrity of the investigation understood."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "Ok the time is now 9:54 and I'll conclude the interview."
