

Trooper Jeremy Gray 2016

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "Ok, this is Sergeant Kenneth Findlay with the Internal Affairs Investigative Unit. Today is Wednesday December 21st, 2016. This is a recorded interview with Trooper Jeremy Gray who is a witness to internal affairs investigation 2016-0733. The time is now 10:24 am. Yeah, 10:24 am. Um, if you could Jeremy, state your name unit number and date of hire."

Trooper Jeremy Gray: "Jeremy A. Gray, date of hire 3/18 of 2001. I'm sorry 3/28 of 2001 my unit number is 1744."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "Um and you're a dayshift troop at Hammond?"

Trooper Jeremy Gray: "Yes work 7-3."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "Ok and you, um, how long have you been up at Hammond?"

Trooper Jeremy Gray: "Uh, I've been at Hammond since August of 2002."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "Ok and were you present on Thursday of November the 10<sup>th</sup>?"

Trooper Jeremy Gray: "Yes."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "And you walked into the barrack?"

Trooper Jeremy Gray: "I came in the backdoor of the barracks and was walking up the stairs on that day."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "And what did you hear?"

Trooper Jeremy Gray: "Um, I heard our secretary, the only thing I heard was the language of fuck you. I'm not sure who it was directed to. It was the words fuck you and then I work, walked to the back of the where the troops room's at."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "Ok, did you see any exchange between her and Lieutenant Campbell or Sergeant Martin or any of the dispatchers?"

Trooper Jeremy Gray: "No."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "Ok, so that's all. You walked in and as the words were being spoken and you hear a door slam or anything?"

Trooper Jeremy Gray: "No, I wasn't paying attention I just kind of like walked towards the back to get away from what was going on. Walked towards the troops room and went back there and kind of got away from what was ever going on and I didn't want to know what was going on."

(Sergeant Kenneth Findlay laughing.)

Trooper Jeremy Gray: "To be honest."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "Ok, alright that seems like a good uh a good method of self-preservation."

Trooper Jeremy Gray: "Yeah."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "Alright is there anything else?"

Trooper Jeremy Gray: "Later on she came back and told Sergeant Martin, I don't know how much longer I couldn't tell you the time I wasn't keeping time but told him that she was going to put some resumes in, and he said if that's what you gotta do then you do that. Then she walked back out the other way, out of the troops room."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "Ok, alright and when you said, when you heard the words the words fuck you. You heard it was Emma saying that?"

Trooper Jeremy Gray: "Yeah I know, I know her voice, she's got a distinctive voice."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "Ok, alright did you hear Lieutenant Campbell or anything say anything to her after?"

Trooper Jeremy Gray: "No."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "No."

Trooper Jeremy Gray: "No, I don't think he commented at all after, or I didn't hear anything."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "Ok, alright anything else?"

Trooper Jeremy Gray: "No."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "Ok, is everything you told me true and factual?"

Trooper Jeremy Gray: "Yes."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "Ok Jeremy I give the standard order not to discuss this I.A. with anybody else."

Trooper Jeremy Gray: "I understand."

Sergeant Kenneth Findlay: "So, understood?"

Trooper Jeremy Gray: "Understood."
